

What do I need to know from previous topics?

The **mezuzah** is incredibly important to Jewish people. They will have it on their doorposts.

Inside the mezuzah is the **Shema** prayer which begin 'Hear O Israel, the Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your strength.'

What will I need to remember for future learning?

Shabbat is the Jewish holy day. It happens every weekend, beginning at sundown on Friday and ending before sundown on Sunday. Jewish people look forward to it all week.

Rosh Hashanah means 'beginning of the year' in **Hebrew**. Festive gatherings with family and friends are a tradition during this holiday. Traditions include eating festive foods, visiting the synagogue and sounding the **shofar**.

The Jewish holiday of **Pesach** commemorates the Exodus of the Jewish people from enslavement in Egypt. Each item on the **Seder Plate** symbolises part of the story.

The **Ten Commandments** are a set of rules that are very important to Jewish people. They show how people should behave.

Torah The holy book for Jewish people which includes Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy.

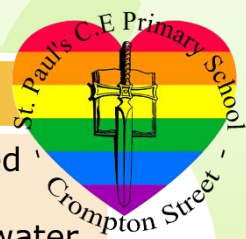

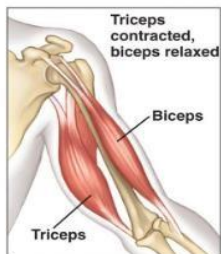
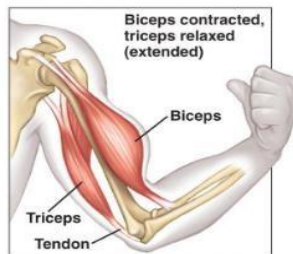


What will I know by the end of the unit?

Animals, including humans, need the right types and amount of nutrition.	When broken our bones will repair themselves. Doctors use casts or splints to make sure they grow back straight.
Animals, including humans cannot make their own food.	Joints allow the body to make movements . The body has many bones and are connected through the joints.
Humans and some other animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement.	Marie Curie was born in Poland in 186. She developed a mobile x-ray machine that was used in World War 1. She was the first woman to be awarded a Nobel Prize and the first person to ever be awarded two Nobel Prizes.
Some animals have a spine and these are called vertebrates.

Diet	Our bodies need a balanced diet to work properly. This involves drinking enough water and eating healthily.
Nutrition	Nutrition involves drinking enough water and eating the right amount of items from the four main food groups.
Muscles	Muscles are attached to bones by tendons and help them to move. When a muscle contracts it gets shorter and pulls on the bone it is attached to.
Skeleton	The human skeleton is made of bone and grows as we grow. Our skull protects our brain and our ribs protect our heart and lungs.
Food Groups	Food groups include carbohydrates, proteins, fruit and vegetables, dairy and fats and oils.

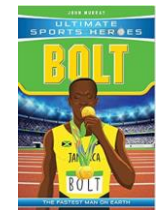
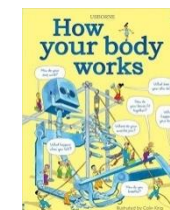

What do I need to know from previous topics?

Warm colours are orange, yellow, and red. Blue, purple, and green tend to be cold colours. Warm and cold colours evoke different moods and feelings in a piece of artwork.

Complementary colours sit across from each other on the colour wheel. When placed next to each other, they create a strong contrast.

Sculptures are 3D pieces of artwork that can be made by carving, modelling or placing materials together.

What will I need to remember for future learning?

Architects are types of artists that plan and design buildings. They may also oversee their construction.

A **running stitch** can be used to join fabric together or add embroidery and detail to a textile piece of art.

Ceramics such as pots and tiles are made from materials such as clay and have been hardened by heat.

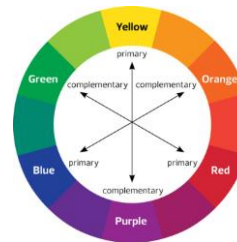

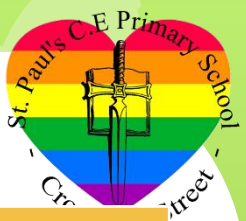
