

When you push the toy car, the wheels turn, which is how the car can move.	The wheels on the toy car move at the same time and speed because each pair of wheels is attached to a pole called an axle . Real vehicles , such as cars and vans, also have axles .		

An **axle** needs to be attached to the chassis (said 'shah-see'). A chassis is the frame upon which the rest of the vehicle is built.


