English

recapping our punctuation and grammar knowledge (commas, speech and parenthesis), improving our proof-reading/editing skills in English and practising a range of spelling patterns.

<u>Maths</u>

In Maths, we will be looking at mastering multiplication and division, which includes the formal written methods. We will be continuing to develop our reasoning and problem solving skills with all four operations. Towards the end of the term, we will explore fractions and statistics.

<u>Science</u>

This half-term, we will be continuing to explore properties and change of materials. This will include learning about permeability, conductivity (electrical/thermal) and solubility. We will investigate if a change of state is reversible and irreversible.
