### English

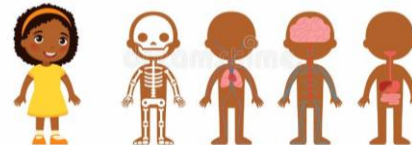


### R.E.
