English

In our English lessons this half term, we will be looking at the lovely book 'The Night Gardener', where the children will become storytellers, creating their own version of the story.

We will also be writing a non-fiction piece all about Bees and pollination!

In Maths in Summer 2, we will be focusing on fractions and decimals and then going into our topic on maths units such as; money, time, shape and measurement.

P.E.
