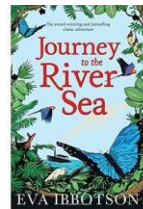
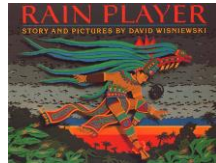

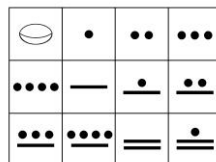
English

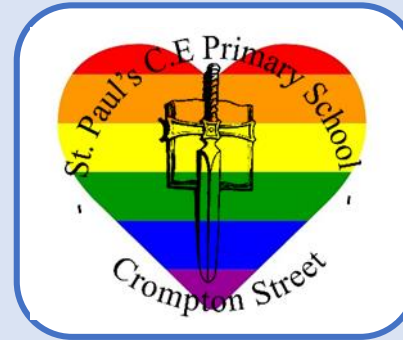
Maths

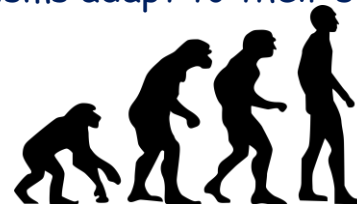
Homework is set every Friday and should be returned by **Wednesday**. Please encourage your child to complete their homework to a high standard.
