## Art and Design - National Curriculum Overview

EYFS: Children have regular opportunities to engage with the arts, enabling them to explore and play with a wide range of media and materials.

KS1: Pupils are taught to use a range of materials creatively to design and make products.

KS2: Pupils are taught to develop their techniques, including their control and their use of materials, with creativity, experimentation and an increasing awareness of different kinds of art, craft and design.

INTENT: Art and Design will engage, inspire and challenge pupils, equipping them with the knowledge and skills to experiment, invent and create their own works of art, craft and design. Children will also know how art and design both reflect and shape our history and contribute to the culture, creativity, diversity and wealth of our nation.

St. Paul's Art and Design curriculum supports our Whole School Golden Threads: Reading, Emotional Well-being and Caring for all Creation. Carefully selected texts are shared during Art and Design lessons to support the learning of reading. Children are encouraged to connect with their environment, appreciate and understand the beauty of the world around them. Transient Art actively promotes the use of natural materials from our school grounds. Children will understand the physical and mental benefits of spending time outdoors.

Across our curriculum, children study the key concepts: drawing, painting, collage, sculpture, textiles, printmaking and digital artwork. Children use sketchbooks to explore the work of other artists and develop their own ideas. They are encouraged to experiment with a range of materials and techniques before deciding which ones to use in their own work, promoting independence.

From the Early Years Foundation Stage, pupils begin painting and mark- making with a range of media and materials. Through drawing and collage units, children develop their fine motor skills with scissors, pencils and paintbrushes. Children throughout school are encouraged to discuss and evaluate their own work and the work of other artists.

As pupils progress, they develop their knowledge and understanding of key artists and art movements, considering how they have influenced our lives and the art we see today. A range of art from different countries and periods are studied in order for children to make connections and encourage critical thinking.
