Brief overview of PE and sport provision in the school

93% of the current Y6 can swim 25m.

All children in school participate in timetabled PE sessions regardless of ability.

We use the experience of visiting sports coaches to supplement PE provision throughout the year and ensure the impact of sports funding is **sustainable** through observations, lesson plans and training of school staff. These include rugby, basketball, netball cricket, rounders, gymnastics and athletics, ensuring children are remaining active, learning skills, playing competitively and coaching.

School participates in interschool competitions which include football and host interschool athletics competitions. The children in KS2 attend the Worsley and Salford schools athletics competitions. Children take part in the Worsley Swimming Gala. Children will take part in competitions organised by the School sports partnership.

School PE and Sport development priorities based on our school context and identified pupil need: Ensure **sustainability** by teachers observing and working with sports coaches and looking at lesson plans.

We have identified sustained level of participation is required in competitive sports events and extra-curricular sports clubs to maintain the silver sports mark and achieve the gold sports mark.

Increase participation in extra-curricular sport through use of external sports coach at lunchtime 4 days per week.

Increase participation in inter and intra school competition through use of external sports coach at lunchtime 4 days per week. Include teams in interschool competitions from throughout KS2.

Include an Active club targeted at KS2 children.

Quality Assurance. What systems are in place to ensure value for money and the involvement of the school leadership team, including the Governing Body, in overseeing the effectiveness of the projects?

Regular termly reports are presented to Governing Body meetings. Finance Governors will monitor effectiveness of spending. Discussion and decisions made at SLT meetings are recorded in minutes and reviewed regularly. Feedback from pupils may be used to guide future planning. Meeting with linked PE governor to discuss sports premium.
