

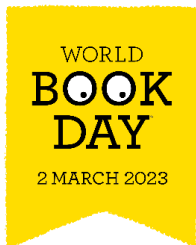

Salford Community Libraries

With all the research supporting the impact of reading on the future success of our children, Salford are having a huge drive to encourage children to access their local libraries.



We are hoping to arrange sessions for our classes to visit Walkden Library in the near future!

Every child visiting with a school will be issued with a temporary membership card. They can then become a full member by visiting with a family member.

There are now no fines for a child returning a late, lost or damaged book.

Reading Council

Our Reading School Council committee are currently talking to classes about the types of books they enjoy reading. Make sure your child shares their favourites with their class committee member as this will help us decide on any future class purchases.

Home reading expectations

We are encouraging children to read everyday at home. If they bring into school their reading record with 7 reads signed by an adult, they will receive a sticker on our class chart. If they receive 3 stickers in a half-term, they will receive a prize. Previous prizes have included bookmarks, pencils and crayons.

The minimum expectation for home reading is 5 times a week of their school reading book, signed by an adult at home.
