

Year 4 Newsletter Summer 2 2022




Welcome back. We hope you have enjoyed the break and are ready to give 100% to all the learning opportunities in your final half term in Year 4.


English

Maths

Our Maths topics for this half term are 'Time', 'Statistics', 'Properties of shape' and 'Position and direction'. We will also continue reinforcing our formal methods for calculations involving +, -, x and ÷.

This half term we are learning new skills to help us to play cricket and netball.




R.E.

Science

In the summer term 2 our topic is 'How could we cope without electricity for a day?' We will be learning about what is needed to make an electrical circuit, constructing one and recognising that a switch opens and closes a circuit.
