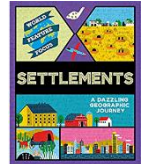

## As Geographers can we.....?

- Describe and understand key aspects of settlements and land use **(all questions)**
- Ask and answer questions about different historical settlements **(1,2,3,)**
- Draw conclusions about the location of historical settlements based on our prior knowledge **(The Romans- 1,2,3,)**
- Compare land use in different areas of the UK using digital mapping (Google Earth) **(4)**
- Identify features on a map, beginning to experiment with four figure grid references **(4)**
- Observe and measure the land use in the immediate locality of school **(5)**
- Investigate where and how people travel to work **(6)**
- Use recognised symbols and keys to mark out areas of interest on our own maps **(7)**

## Cross curricular links:

**Maths:** Read and create maps with symbols and keys. Understand and use 4 figure grid references.

**English:** Write an information report describing what historical settlements were like for the Celts, the Romans and the Anglo-Saxons
